Thursday: For the Church and her pastors; for missionaries, teachers, deaconesses, and

other servants of Christ and His Church; for the fruitful and salutary use of the

blessed Sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood.

Friday: For the preaching of the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ; for its spread

throughout the whole world; for the persecuted; for the sick and dying.

Saturday: For faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the

faith or have fallen away; for pastors as they prepare to administer Christ's holy

gifts; for receptive hearts and minds on the Lord's Day.
